

Guidelines for Heads of States and Sherpas of the G200 Youth Summit 2017

To be the Head of State or Sherpa* of a national delegation for the G200 Youth Summit 2017 means to have an honor to be the leader of your national delegation and to have additional responsibilities on the team preparations.

*Sherpas are assistants to the Heads of States in issues related to the G200 Association. During the G200 Youth Summit Sherpas assist the Heads of States to coordinate the work of the national delegations.

What are the main responsibilities of the Head of State and Sherpas?

- ✓ Communication within the delegation during the whole preparation period;
- ✓ Being a team leader and coordinating your national delegation before and during the G200 Youth Summit;
- ✓ Preparation of pre-reading materials list for the Ministers, submission no later than **October 27, 2017**;
- ✓ Coordination of the preparation and submission of position papers of the Ministers. The papers must be sent to the Organizing Committee no later than **October 27, 2017**.
